This book is a valuable resource for content reading and writing ideas that are both effective in practice and appealing to students.

- **Naming The World** – Nanci Atwell's incomparable poetry resource. Atwell's book is filled with lessons on how to engage students in really reading good poetry with clarity. Atwell's strong sense of what young adults like, connect with, and respond to is impeccable. I used this book with 8<sup>th</sup> graders for a full year and never found it lacking.

Not only did student responses become more insightful, even the most reluctant reader requested "poetry" days.
